<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No law that explicitly lays down VP and PE, but laws to protect children (KJHG and Act concerning the protection for young people in public)</li> <li>• Since 2005 a draft bill for a preventing law</li> <li>• Resolution of the Minister President conference 2003 to the outlawry of violence and to strengthening the upbringing strength of families and schools</li> <li>• Financing of projects of violence prevention is not judicial regulated</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Decree of 12.05.04 to provide measures against school disengagement, exclusion and violence at school</li> <li>• For basic education institutions an action plan against school disengagement, exclusion and violence has been established</li> <li>• Association for the Prevention of Violence in Schools carries out project to prevent violence in schools</li> <li>• Association “No Violence in Schools”</li> <li>• Open environment assistance</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Kindergartens have responsibility in society for the early prevention of discrimination and bullying (Framework plan for the Content and Tasks of Kindergartens, 2006, social mandate of kindergartens, p 5)</li> <li>• Manifesto against bullying 2005 emphasises statutory right to a good kinder-garten and school environment that promotes health, well-being and learning. Social competence has been introduced into schools as a basic skill</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Anti-discrimination law at schools, all schools have to develop a strategy of “equal treatment plan”</li> <li>• The curriculum mentions a lot of important values for PE</li> <li>• Children’s Ombudsman</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No special law, to help in critical situations there is the Polish Nationwide Emergency Service for Victims of Domestic Violence</li> <li>• In 2006 Resolution Nr 162/2006 of the Council of Ministers pursuant to Article 10 of the <i>law of July 29 2005 on counteracting domestic violence</i> to be implemented in 2006-2009</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• General guidelines and actions at the national level for the prevention and fight against bullying (Ministry of Education, February 2007)</li> <li>• Recommendation for the adoption of programmes peace education in schools (Ministry of Public Education, October 2007)</li> </ul>
